Can you imagine what our lives will be like in the year 2050? Perhaps you will be flying off for a holiday on the moon, or maybe you will be taking your dog for a walk in virtual reality. We recently carried out a survey of 1,000 people from different countries to find out what they think life will be like in the future. The results clearly demonstrate both our hopes and fears.

The survey suggests that friendship – one of the most important human relationships – will have changed dramatically. People will make friends through the Internet. What is more, a large number of people will even come across their future husbands and wives in this way! Computers will have become absolutely essential by 2050. They also believe that travel on our own planet will probably change. Almost everyone thinks that there will be no cars in the city centres. Pollution is something that seems to worry many people. Some fear that it will continue to get worse, and that our planet will become impossible to live on. Others even foresee that one day we'll have to pay for clean air just like we do now for clean water.

On the other hand, people seem to be quite optimistic about benefits of genetic engineering, as they think scientists will use it to cure diseases like cancer and AIDS. If scientists manage to find cure for these, we'll have a much healthier society.

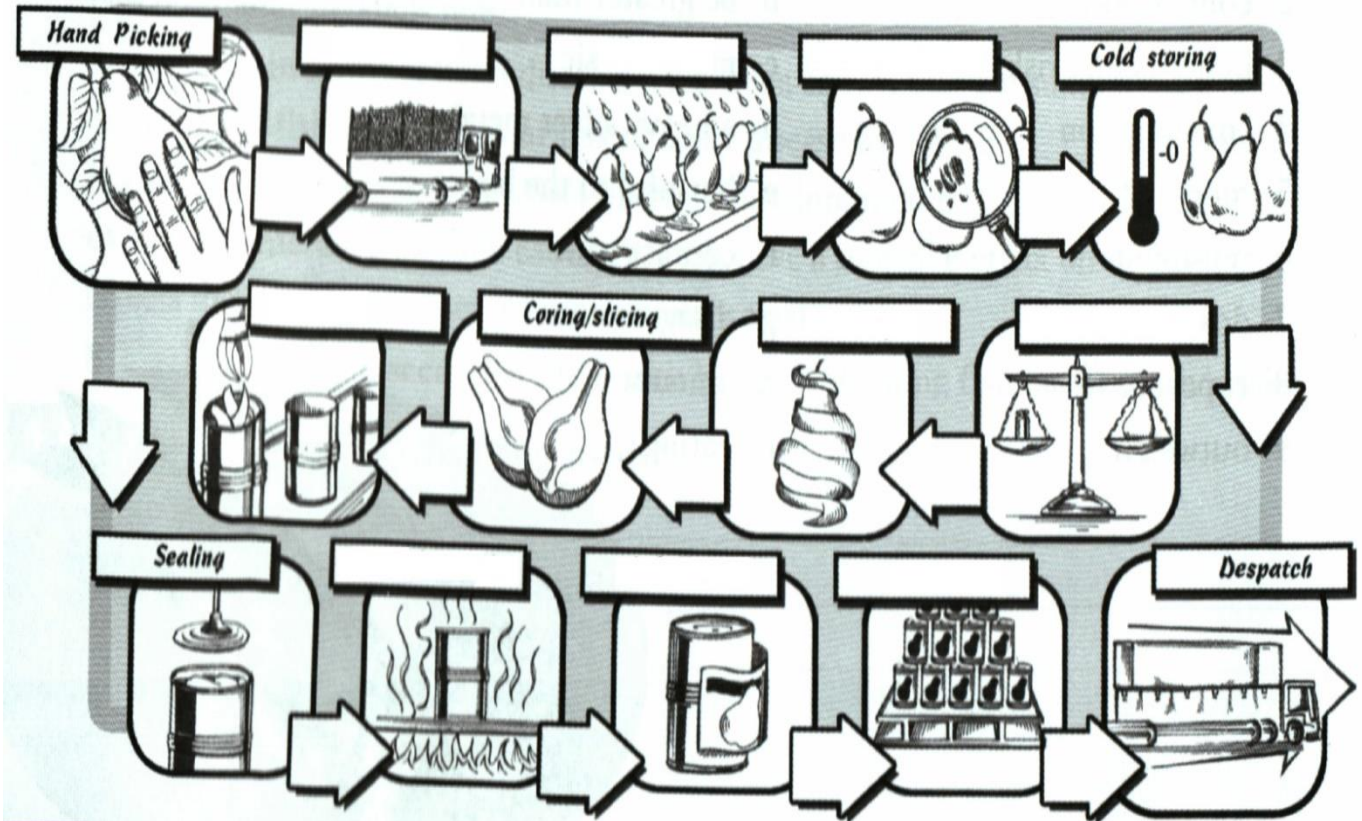
